Welcome back. I hope you enjoyed the half-term break. This half-term is always a very busy one as we work through Advent in preparation for Christmas celebrations.

### Weekly Theme

This week we have had a focus on Diwali, the festival of light and the story of Rama and Sita. We also discussed Jesus as 'light of the world' and the importance of light to many faiths and religions as it represents light over dark, good over evil and lights guiding us to make the right choices on our journey of life.

### All Saints Day

Today, 1st November, we celebrate the Feast day of All Saints. Key Stage 2 attended Mass in school. Thank you to all parents/carers who attended. It was lovely to have you with us.

### Halloween and Bonfire Night

We have discussed both Halloween and Bonfire night this week. We know that they can be occasions which children enjoy and have fun. However, we have discussed the responsibility for our actions and keeping ourselves and others safe. We were joined by Greater Manchester Fire Service to lead assemblies today for Key Stage 2 on the safety messages related to fire and fireworks, including the 'stop, drop, roll' technique if clothing was to catch fire.

# Mini Blue Lights Project

On Tuesday morning, we were joined by representatives of the emergency services: fire, police and ambulance with their emergency vehicles. Our year 6 children are taking part in a pilot project involving partners from the emergency services. It is a really exciting addition to our curriculum which will help to develop life skills such as CPR and first aid, an understanding of the work of the emergency services and the impact of anti-social behaviour on services and the potential consequences. The focus this week was on fire safety. We were also joined by our local councillors, the mayoress and several departments from the local authority. Year 6 are really excited to be part of this project and received hoodies and other goodies.

### Early Years

Children in pre-school and reception enjoyed workshops to learn about Diwali this week. They made diva lamps, took part in dance activities and found out more about this celebration of light.
